

Elmdale Elementary Scholarship Guidelines

Purpose

The Elmdale Elementary Scholarship Fund provides scholarships to Springdale High and Har-Ber High School seniors who have the ability and motivation to complete the post-secondary course of study, and the willingness to work to supplement the scholarship funds received.

The Scholarship helps deserving students continue their education by providing financial assistance for tuition, fees, and books.

Eligibility

Qualified applicants must be a:

- Graduating senior from Springdale High School or Har-Ber High School
- Enrolled in a four-year or two-year college in pursuit of a degree

Criteria

1. The criteria for selection of the scholarship recipient is determined by the selection committee, and may include, but not limited to, demonstrated leadership in school, community involvement, and character.

Amount of Scholarship

The amount of the scholarship is \$500.00 for one senior from Springdale High School and \$500.00 for one senior from Har-Ber High School. Changes to the scholarship amount may be determined by the scholarship selection committee based on factors including, but not limited to, the amount of funds available from the scholarship fund.

Application Process is as follows:

1. Complete applications and required paperwork are due to the Scholarship Committee % Scholarship Chairman, at Har-Ber High School or Springdale High School, on or before April 1st, 2017. **Current high school transcripts must be provided.**
2. Applicants may be interviewed by the selection committee.
3. Applicants will be notified of final scholarship decisions on or before May 5, 2017
4. Applicants must provide proof of enrollment in a four-year or two-year program by September 15, 2017 to claim awarded scholarship. Scholarships will be paid directly to the program specified by applicant.
5. Please attach why you think you deserve this scholarship?

Age, race, sex, marital status, or religious affiliation will have no bearing on eligibility for this scholarship.
